American Gothic was painted in 1930 by Grant Wood. It is currently at The Art Institute of Chicago. Wood was inspired to paint what is now known as the American Gothic House in Eldon, Iowa. The people in the painting are "the kind of people [he] fancied should live in that house". It depicts a farmer and his daughter. People often think she is his wife. The painting's name is a word play on the house's architectural style, Carpenter Gothic.



**The Girl With a Pearl Earring** was painted by **Johannes Vermeer** around **1665**. It depicts a European girl wearing a dress, a turban, and a **very large pearl** as an earring. The woman in the painting is **unknown**. She may have been a model, or **someone from the Bible**. There has been speculation that she is the artist's **eldest daughter**, Maria. Although **Art Historians** cannot agree if this is true.



The Great Wave off Kanagawa is a woodblock print by an artist called Hokusai. It was created in 1831 during the Edo period of Japanese history. The print depicts three boats moving through a stormy sea, with a large wave in the centre and Mount Fuji visible in the background. The print is Hokusai's best-known work and possible the most famous Japanese artwork.



The Persistence of Memory is a 1931 painting by artist Salvador Dalí and one of the most recognizable works of Surrealism. Since 1934 the painting has been in the collection of the Museum of Modern Art in New York City. It is widely recognized in popular culture and sometimes is referred to by more descriptive titles, such as "Melting Clocks", "The Soft Watches" or "The Melting Watches".
