A Territorial Acknowledgement

Thompson Rivers University campuses are on the traditional lands of the Tk'emlúps te Secwépemc (Kamloops campus) and the T'exelc (Williams Lake campus) within Secwépemc'ulucw, the traditional and unceded territory of the Secwépemc. The region TRU serves also extends into the territories of the St'át'imc, Nlaka'pamux, Tŝilhqot'in, Nuxalk, and Dakelh.

FORT ST. JOHN

Fort St. John, as well as other communities in NorthEastern BC and NorthWest AB rest on the traditional lands of the Beaver People, as well as the Michif Piyii (Métis) and Dënéndeh people. This area remained unceded until May of 1900, as the Beaver People were the last to sign Treaty 8. There are several Reserves in this area such as the Beaton, Blueberry River and Doig River Reserves..
